

# Daylesford Convent & Gallery

Today we make our way to the beautiful town of Daylesford. The township of Daylesford is located between Castlemaine and Creswick, within a region that contains Australia's largest concentration of natural mineral springs.

Nestled on the crest of Wombat Hill Botanical Gardens, overlooking Daylesford. The Convent boasts expansive views of the countryside and township below. A feast for the senses, the gallery is more than a three level haven of fine art in an historic 19th century mansion. The Convent's origins date back to the 1860s Gold Rush.

Built as a private residence for the Gold Commissioner, it was then known as "Blarney Castle". The Catholic Church purchased the building in the 1880s for its presbytery. We stop at the Convent Gallery for, Tour and Lunch.
